Hospice Peterborough Annual Report 2011/2012 Caring for Our Community: Today and Tomorrow

A Message from the President and Executive Director

The challenge facing Hospice Peterborough today is identifying our role in the changing landscape of health care delivery and making sure we are prepared to meet the hospice palliative care needs of our community moving forward. This has been a busy and satisfying year at Hospice Peterborough. Last year we saw a 26% increase in referrals and, to be honest, we wondered if this was an anomaly. It was not. Referrals this year surpassed last year's record numbers. We wondered how we could provide the care with a minimal funding increase from the LHIN. We made some staffing and volunteer changes and our community stepped forward to fill the gap. We have actively pursued the establishment of a residential hospice and are close to securing enhanced space to meet our programming needs.

<u>Ontario's Action Plan for Health Care</u> introduced in January 2012 states, "The health care landscape has changed dramatically over the past several decades. New technology, drugs and procedures have increased life expectancy and greatly improved patient care. Our aging and growing population has increasingly put pressures on the system. Correspondingly, expectations of the health care system have increased almost as fast as the budget. All these pressures are significant "drivers" of health care costs to the point where the untenable escalation in health care costs is the biggest threat to ensuring that the system will be there for future generations."

One of the key health strategies is to shift care from the more expensive acute sector to the community sector. The focus is "*The Right Care at the Right Time and In the Right Place."* Hospice Peterborough is part of the community team that is being called upon to provide quality care in a more cost effective way. We are very excited that our Central East Local Health Integration Network (CELHIN) has identified hospice palliative care as a priority area for their next Integrated Health Service Plan. We are working closely with the LHIN and the Hospice Palliative Care Network to establish goals and ensure sustainable strategies for care are created.

A provincial palliative care initiative, <u>Declaration of Partnership and Commitment to Action</u>, describes an integrated continuum of care options and recognizes the important role that care settings play in providing support to adults and children with life limiting illness. Plans to achieve this vision of care are being developed to ensure all Ontarians have equitable access to high quality care while keeping quality and sustainability as a central focus of improvement. Hospice Peterborough will participate by working within our LHIN to establish partnerships that address gaps in care and enhance capacity.

Consider a quote by Oliver Wendell Holmes: "I find the great thing in this world is not so much where we stand, as in what direction we are moving: To reach the port of heaven, we must sail sometimes with the wind and sometimes against it, but we must sail, and not drift, nor lie at anchor." It is an exciting time for Hospice Peterborough as we sail in the direction of developing residential hospice and enhancing our programs to meet the growing needs of our community.

OUR PEOPLE

Hospice is a people place. Wherever we go to provide care or information we make sure we create a space where people feel comfortable. At our hospice home our rooms are cozy, the colours are calming and we have tried our best to create a welcoming atmosphere, a place of hope and caring. Although our home is truly lovely we know that it is the people present in our space that create the unique feeling that permeates the essence of the work we do. Our staff, volunteers, committee and board members all set the tone for the care we provide at Hospice Peterborough.

We have a stable and strong staff and volunteer team at Hospice Peterborough. Our staff care team consists of Marg Rose - Palliative Care Coordinator, David Kennedy - Bereavement Coordinator, and Paula Greenwood - Coordinator of Volunteers. This year, following the direction of our Strategic Plan "to expand our programs and services to meet the growing needs of our Diverse community", we welcomed Ann Wannamaker as a part time Palliative Care Facilitator, working closely with Marg to ensure we can support our families in a timely fashion.

"Everyone at Hospice has been extremely supportive, understanding, helpful, sympathetic & compassionate during this difficult time. Our **Volunteer Support Committee**, led by Bill Graham, organized some excellent training and debriefing sessions for our volunteer team. Volunteers lead groups, help with fundraising, reception, home and garden maintenance, serve on committees and provide agency governance through our board. Our volunteers donated 11,250 hours to our organization. We could not meet the needs of our community without their dedication, true caring spirits, breadth of skill, energy, ideas and passion.

Angela O'Brien, Alison Casey and our team of fundraising, reception and administrative volunteers keep things running smoothly behind the scenes: meeting the accountability demands of our funders, insuring we have the necessary funds to meet the needs of our community and welcoming everyone who calls or drops in to our hospice home.

We are fortunate to have a highly dedicated and committed **Board of Directors**. We recently completed a governance review through the Board Development Committee. Recommendations are being solidified to ensure we continue to be a well run and high functioning organization.

PROGRAMS and SERVICES

Our programming focuses on two areas: support for people and families living with serious illness and support for those who are bereaved. On any given day we have approximately 100 ill clients registered with Hospice Peterborough and an additional 200 receiving bereavement and family support. Last year we cared for **1126** individuals, an increase of 16%. We offer more than 20 different programs and last year held **519** group sessions attended by **5496** people, an increase of 43% over last year.

In our **Bereavement** Program, David Kennedy is connecting broadly with our community, offering education, guidance and developing new programming as needed. Lyle Horn continues to facilitate 3 levels of Grief Recovery Groups with the help of our amazing volunteers. This year we introduced a participant's

workbook for Grief Groups 1 and 2, which has been very well received. We also offer our Lunch Group for the Recently Bereaved and our monthly Group for Bereaved Parents. One of the participants in our Bereaved Parent's Support Group sent David an email after the group and said,

"Last night's get together helped me greatly. It was not so much what was said so much as how I was listening. I heard hope. I heard empowerment."

David, Marg and Paula also offered regular **debriefing** sessions for health care providers from PRHC and a number of other agencies throughout our community. These sessions provided an opportunity for professionals to deal with the challenges and grief encountered in the work place.

Raechelle Vyn ran our **children's groups** regularly all year. We had greater difficulty organizing teen groups and found the best way to connect was in individual sessions. David has been exploring a cutting edge project to engage our teens and we hope to get that started in the Fall of 2012.

At Hospice our **Palliative Program** offers information, advocacy, and referral and connects client support volunteers with our families in unique ways. We support individuals and families wherever they are: at home, in long term care or retirement residences or in the hospital.

The relationships and genuine caring that grow from our **Day Hospice** is truly wonderful. This year we have been so pleased to see growth in the number of men attending this program on a regular basis. The women of our Wednesday group continue to welcome new members and generously help us with our Hike for Hospice, calling us to circle with their drumming and leading us on our Hike. This past year we have had to say goodbye to some dear friends from this group and held a special Memorial Service in our garden to give everyone: staff, volunteers and group members, a chance to reflect and honour our relationships. This program would not be possible without the volunteer support of our group and activity facilitators and our Caring


Cooks who plan, prepare and serve nutritious snacks and lunches every week.

The **Palliative Pain and Symptom Management Consultation Service** offers education and consultation to professional caregivers across the Northeast cluster of the CE-LHIN. This year Patti Stanton and Elaine Jeanes continued their strong partnership with the Four Counties Long Term Care Network and other community partners. Marg Eggelton also joined the PPSMC team this past year to deliver professional education across the four counties.

We will continue to evaluate our programming to ensure we are meeting the needs of people of all ages living with serious illness and grief in our community.

OUR FUNDING

Hospice Peterborough is grateful for ongoing support from the **Central East Local Health Integration Network (CE-LHIN),** our major funder. The LHIN, through its Integrated Health Service Plan, provides a framework for care delivery and a focus for programming. This year the LHIN has introduced an integration strategy that will guide our planning moving forward, with an emphasis on creating administrative and operational efficiencies through back office integration and innovative partnerships. The LHIN funding was 48% of our revenue last year and is critical for the ongoing function of Hospice.



We also received funding from the **CE Community Care Access Centre** to provide **interdisciplinary palliative education** to professional caregivers in the four counties through the Palliative Pain and Symptom Management Consultation Program.



This year **Festival of Trees** offered a re-imagined event, with a new location, new events and a new operating structure. Even though it was a year for rebuilding Festival continued its strong tradition of raising funds for healthcare in our community and was able to make a sizable donation to its three beneficiaries. With last year's donation of \$43,000 to Hospice Peterborough the grand total of funds donated to us over the past 21 years is **\$1,440,000**. Our thanks to FOT chairs Wayne Harding, Carol Corner and Val McCrae who led a dedicated team of volunteers. Festival has exciting plans for the upcoming year: a change in the venue, new events, new trees and lots of opportunities for our community to have fun while supporting healthcare.

We also must thank our treasurer, Leah Curtis, who took over from our past treasurer Brian Higgins in mid year. Our **Finance Committee** continues to offer us sound financial advice. We end the year in strong financial shape, within our budget, and with the resources to meet the current demands of our programs.

OUR COMMUNITY

Our Strategic Plan directs us to form strong community partnerships to *ensure maximum benefit from all the resources available for hospice palliative care.* The CELHIN's current focus on the integration of the Community Support Sector will expand and solidify integrations across the LHIN over the next 3 years. We know it is vital to nurture our close working relationships with our community partners. We value being a part of our community's care team and continue to work closely with: **Peterborough Regional Health Centre, Central East Community Care Access Centre, the Central East Community Support Sector, Long Term Care** facilities and **retirement homes** in Peterborough City and County.

Our strategic plan guides us to *increase awareness about Hospice Peterborough's services, goals and our need for financial and volunteer support*. This year we updated our 4 part community education series to help meet this goal. Sessions included: *Advance Care Planning, From Me to We: the Challenges of Budgeting and Living On My Own, Navigating the Health Care System*, and *But I don't Know What to Say*. Thank you to **Highland Park Visitation and Reception Centre**, our education sponsor. Our **Community Relations and Education Committee**, headed by Katie Stewart organized an excellent education day, titled *Emerging Issues in Hospice Palliative Care*. Our speakers presented material on ethics, spirituality, music, expressive arts, medical perspectives on treatment decisions, and directions in patient centred care. The Committee has also offered informational sessions at long term care and retirement homes and continue to keep our brochures distributed across the county.

This year we formed a unique partnership with **Dignity Memorial** and **Comstock Funeral Home and Cremation Centre**. The **Dignity Drivers** program matches staff and vehicles from Comstocks with our clients and family members who need assistance with transportation. Prompt, flexible and responsive, our clients only have positive things to say about the Dignity Drivers. "*Everyone is so helpful and respectful and I always enjoy our conversations. Thank you."*

We continue to work closely with the **Central East Local Health Integration Network**, responding to LHIN directives and attending educational sessions and offering feedback as requested. In addition, our Board President Dawn Straka joined the CE-LHIN Board to Board Collaborative and has participated in board educational sessions offered by **Hospice Palliative Care Ontario**. We also participate in the **Central East Hospice Palliative Care Network** and contributed to the development of the *Central East Hospice Palliative Care Program Strategy*, delivered to our LHIN last August.

We extend our sincere thanks to **St. Andrew's United Church** congregation for their ongoing support. Their willingness to share space with us on an "as needed" basis helped us numerous times this past year as we struggle to find the space to deliver our programs. Who would have thought 10 years ago when we moved in that we would be filled to capacity?

Our **Residential Hospice and Property Committee**, led by Andy Fasken, has had an exceptionally busy year, as they worked to secure the right property for us to create a centre of excellence for the delivery of hospice palliative care and bereavement support. The Peterborough Housing Corporation and City of Peterborough have been instrumental in helping us move forward with the acquisition of the property. This

is just the first step. To be successful we now must create the vision to engage our whole community in this vital project.

As we reflect on all we have accomplished together over the past 24 years, we recognize our journey has been fueled by the compassion, kindness and generosity of our community.
