For almost 40 years, Dr. John Beamish has played a crucial role in making Hospice Peterborough what it is today

Hospice Peterborough started out as a community dream. One of the earliest dreamers was Dr. John Beamish.

Dr. Beamish was one of the founding members of Hospice Peterborough in 1988. He has served many important roles within the organization, including board member, mentor to staff, donor, and currently serves as Medical Director for Community Programs and the Hospice Residence.

In addition to a longstanding family practice, Dr. Beamish has been providing excellent palliative care to patients living in the City and County of Peterborough for more than four decades. During this time, palliative care has evolved from a discipline on the fringes of medicine, to a respected part of the care continuum. He is considered by many to be a trailblazer in the palliative field.

In the early days of Hospice Peterborough, Dr. Beamish would participate in weekly client and system reviews that resulted in not only better care for clients, but also incredible growth of Hospice and palliative supports in the community for clients and their families. His knowledge, responsiveness, good humour, and ability to empower patients with information to make their own care decisions continue to be commended today.

In addition to his legacy at Hospice Peterborough, Dr. Beamish has played an integral role in establishing community health initiatives including Ontario's Community

Palliative On-call Physician (CPOC) group and the 360 Clinic, which provides more equitable healthcare to people who struggle to use regular services in our community. In 2021, he was awarded the Dr. S. Lawrence Librach Award for Palliative Medicine in the Community and Rotary Club of Peterborough Kawartha's Paul Harris Fellow for community service. His impact on community-focused, compassionate healthcare for all will undoubtedly live on for generations to come.

My stepdad Chris had been taking care of my mom at home until that point but things were getting increasingly difficult. We leaned into the support offered within the community but there was no avoiding what this meant for my family. My mom said her final goodbye to her home. We knew she would be spending the rest of her life at Hospice.

My mom and stepdad were welcomed into Hospice with a warmth that we didn't know we needed. Our family was operating in what felt like a survival mode. We were all trying to be there for my mom and to support my stepdad anyway we could. Once my mom moved into Hospice, their skillful and compassionate staff, offered care and comfort for my mom that allowed us to be more present with her."

Dr. Naheed Dosani shares his Powerful Work in Palliative Care for the Homeless on What Now? Podcast

Dr. Dosani is the founder of PEACH (Palliative Care and Education for the Homeless)

How can we better ensure *everyone* in our community has access to palliative care?

In our latest podcast episode, the What Now? hosts were honoured to speak with Dr. Naheed Dosani. Dr. Dosani is a palliative physician in Toronto and founder of Palliative Education and Care for the Homeless (PEACH). The PEACH program, based out of the Inner City Health Associates (ICHA) in Toronto, provides community based hospice palliative care to individuals regardless of their housing status or factors such as mental health, poverty or substance use.

Through their work and advocacy, the team at PEACH have challenged the status quo and brought equity to the health caresystem by providing palliative and hospice care directly to those living on the street.

Dr. Dosani's inspirational words and actions challenge and encourage us to see the humanity in our society's most vulnerable and oftentimes forgotten members.
