

# Inaugural Child and Family Grief Retreat Forges Connections through Shared Loss

#### "Magical."

That was the word that stood out for Family & Child Life Specialist Sheila Bourgeois when looking back on Hospice Peterborough's inaugural child and family grief retreat that took place in late September. "The word people have used over and over again to describe the day is *magical*."

Amidst the fall colours and campfire smoke of Buckhorn's Tecasy Ranch, seven families with children and teens gathered, united by the grief of losing a close family caregiver. Starting out as a long held dream of past and present Hospice Peterborough staff, the retreat finally became possible through generous support from the Kindred Foundation. The Kindred Foundation's partner organization, Tecasy Ranch, provided an ideal setting for the retreat: 550 beautiful natural wooded acres and spaces for gathering and an appropriate mission of "Connecting people to nature, people to people and people to a Greater Cause."

The day opened with the families gathering around a fire pit to introduce their loved one who died through story. During this introduction, many families noted that their person had a love of being in nature. This underscored not only the significance of the setting but also how appropriate the primarily nature-based planned activities were for honouring those that had died. The attendees navigating loss were markedly intergenerational: ranging from ages 5 to almost 50.

The connection with nature was made even stronger through "forest bathing" – a practice originating from Japan that invites participants to tune into their senses and find calm while immersed in nature. During the forest bathing, which was led by a Tecasy volunteer, a young participant lay down on the forest floor. Though the participant later shared that he had been lying on a rock – which caused some discomfort – he continued to lay there. He had not wanted to interrupt his forest bath by moving.

Hearing this story, one may recall the writing of Jessica Watson, who relates grief to "carrying a stone in your pocket." She writes: "You feel it. You always feel it. But depending on the way you stand or the way your body moves, the smooth edges might barely graze your body." *He continued to lay there.* 

As well as nature, the day drew connections between participants with shared experiences. Sheila described two boys, playing soccer together. This normal childhood activity took on additional meaning as both boys had experienced the death of their fathers – an experience that is foreign to most of their peers and different than losing an extended family member.

In the warm afternoon sun, a volunteer led the participants in an activity reminiscent of Japanese Kintsugi: the practice of restoring fractured pottery with precious metals. The practice highlights the history of the object rather than trying to hide where breaks have occurred. It often resonates with those who may see their grief experience differently upon realizing they don't need to hide the cracks it has caused. Even an object that has been pieced back together can be beautiful.

Karie McDougall, Events Coordinator at Tecasy Ranch, shared: "We were truly honoured to host the child and family grief retreat in collaboration with Hospice Peterborough. It was a deeply meaningful experience for all involved. The serene surroundings of Tecasy Ranch provided the perfect backdrop for healing. We were privileged to offer yoga and forest therapy sessions for the children, youth, and adults, creating a safe and nurturing environment for families to come together and find solace during their journey of grief.

We are committed to providing the kind of support that fosters both emotional and physical healing and we look forward to continuing our partnership with Hospice Peterborough in the future."

When asked why these kinds of retreats are so important, Sheila replied: "I think there's a beauty in having dedicated time to sink in and explore and feel grief. It's hard to make time for that in our everyday lives for that purpose. It allows us protected time to reflect, experience, and connect with other people who are navigating similar circumstances."

At the end of the day, participants who arrived as strangers with loss in common shared contact info to keep in touch, expanding their network of support. Hospice Peterborough is already planning ways to keep the group connected through a follow up retreat next year. And so, the magic continues...

#### Make an Immediate Difference

**Helpful tip:** Online gifts must be received by Hospice Peterborough on or before December 31, 2023 for your donation to qualify this year. Cash, cheque, or any in-person donations must be received before December 29, 2023 at 12pm.

#### **Appreciated Securities**

Donating appreciated stocks, mutual funds or stock options means you pay no tax on the capital gains and receive a tax receipt for the fair market value of the securities. This efficient alternative to cash provides a substantial tax incentive and gives you the satisfaction of seeing your gift put to use today. Securities can include stocks, mutual funds, and employee stock options.

For certain donors, it may be beneficial to donate before the end of calendar year 2023 instead of waiting until 2024.

**Helpful tip:** Upcoming changes to the Alternative Minimum Tax (AMT) system, will take place January 1, 2024, and could impact some Canadians as well as having a profound impact on large charitable donations, which are often made via a gift of appreciated securities.
