# Tim and Leslie Keating makes generous donation that allows residents' visitors to store their own food

Tim Keating wanted to support Hospice Peterborough and asked staff how he could help people have a better experience when living in the end-of-life residence.

He didn't expect the response to be mini fridges.

His older sister Kim Keating, an RPN who works in the residence, told him that having mini fridges in each of the 10 private rooms would be a nice touch as visitors and family members could store their own food and – especially during the pandemic help avoid any cross-contamination in the common fridge.

Tim says he happily bought the 10 mini fridges, which Hospice received this month.

"When people think of donating, they think the donation has to be massive and it really doesn't," Tim says. "I'm fortunate to be in a position to help in small ways and a lot of times, it's the small things, especially when done collectively, that can make the biggest difference."

The Bridgenorth resident says Hospice is a special place and you certainly don't need to know anybody who has used a hospice to understand their value.

"I think it's fair to say that all of us are going to need a place like that someday and it is relevant to all," he says. "It's a great cause."

## Volunteer Turned Staff: Meet Our Cook Andrea Barrett

#### With decades of experience in Peterborough's eateries, Andrea now finds contentment in making comfort food and special meals for residents in a kitchen that many say smells like 'home'

When Andrea Barrett officially started her new position as cook at Hospice Peterborough last month, she was continuing in a role she had already been enjoying for more than a year.

Andrea – who has decades of experience in restaurants across Peterborough – started volunteering in the Hospice kitchen in late 2019 as a way to give back to the community.

After volunteering, and then working on contract throughout the pandemic, her friend Greg Marshak resigned as cook in order to move to the East Coast and Andrea ended up taking over.

She says she couldn't be happier creating special meals for people in the residence, baking homemade treats for family members and, perhaps most importantly, making personal connections with staff, volunteers and visitors who often tell her that the aromas remind them of "home."

"It is so rewarding to make a resident an icecream sandwich from scratch – just because they're craving one – or preparing a rainbow trout as a resident's favourite meal," Andrea says. "Being able to do that kind of thing is what makes this place so special."

Many people recognize Andrea from her 30 years of working at downtown restaurants such as The Only Café and St. Veronus. She has also been employed at Peterborough mainstays such as Black Honey, The Olde Stone Brewing Company and Hot Belly Mama's.

In late 2019, she took Hospice's thoughtful and thorough 10-week volunteer training program and enjoyed learning about issues such as pain management and how to best communicate with those at the end of their life and those who are grieving.

After starting volunteering, and working on contract throughout the pandemic, she enjoyed making dinners as well as homemade soups, banana bread and her signature cheese scones.

As a friendly and outgoing person, she also enjoyed chatting and developing strong bonds with residents as well as their families - often writing down recipes for visitors or bringing a fresh slice of lemon loaf to a wife who has slept over in the residence with her husband.

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Andrea is sharing her years of experience in the kitchen with Hospice Peterborough residents, clients, and families.

The job doesn't really feel like a job, she says, as she's happy to "clock out" but still stay a while to chat with residents, help out with cleaning duties or even garden.

"That's just the kind of place this is," she says. "It's why Hospice Peterborough has hundreds of volunteers."

## 'Conversations About Dying' Podcasts Now Available

#### Hospice Peterborough offers podcasts on YouTube to engage people in what can be a difficult topic

When a doctor tells you, 'There is nothing else we can do,' this may be true medically, but spiritually, the real work may just be starting.

The latest episode of our podcasts is about finding meaning and spirituality at the end of life. In 'Finding Meaning and Spirituality,' our supportive care counsellors Red Keating, David Kennedy (now retired) and Julie Brown explore the role of spirituality in the dying process.

Hospice Peterborough started offering free podcasts on our YouTube channel mid-May so that you can sit in the comfort of your home or office and listen to thought- provoking conversations about the many issues surrounding death and palliative care.

You can watch (or re-watch) the premiere episode, which focuses on the impact of COVID-19 on loss of ritual such as funerals and celebrations of life - that help us deal with our grief.

The <u>second episode</u> focuses on the challenge of talking about death - the

practical nature of it as well as our fears – because we live in a world that is consumed with living life as much as possible and often trying to ignore the inevitable ending.

Ms. Brown says the podcasts are a great way to share thoughts, philosophize and inspire others to have sometimes difficult conversations.

Future topics will include the grief journey, death around the world and the experience of caregivers.
