### New Board members:

#### **Brooke Dickey**

Brooke Dickey brings a diverse background in social work, education, research, and business leadership to her role with Hospice Peterborough. She earned an Honours BA in Psychology and a Bachelor of Social Work from University of Windsor, followed by a Master of Social Work from University of Toronto. She later pursued doctoral studies at the University of Toronto, completing her Ph.D. coursework and advancing dissertation research focused on trafficking in women from Eastern European countries before a significant personal and professional life transition redirected her path. Throughout her academic career, Brooke participated in several government-funded research projects and publications related to gerontology and human trafficking. She also served as a lecturer with the University of Toronto's Faculty of Social Work, teaching graduate-level courses in Research Methodologies and Critical Appraisal of Social Work Research Literature. After relocating permanently to Peterborough, Brooke joined Sir Sandford Fleming College, where she taught in both the Social Service Worker and Drug & Alcohol Counsellor programs. She also worked as a Therapist and Accommodations Counsellor, supporting students through a wide range of personal and academic challenges. Since 2004, Brooke and her husband have owned and operated a local disaster restoration company, combining entrepreneurial leadership with a strong commitment to community service.
